












Achievements in various Teacher Eligibility Tests

Name of the program: SNEHAPOORVAM

Objectives of the program

- To develop social consciousness among student teachers.
- To enhance the interaction between community and Sree Narayana training College.
- To disseminate awareness session on various subjects among the rural community.

The context

The period 2018-19 is marked by the period of Kerala flood 2018- 19. So the institutional activities during the year focused on the flood relief programmes volunteered by the student union 2018-2019.

The practice

The flood really for activities of the college has been undertaken in different phases. During the initial stage of Kerala flood the students and faculty of the college collected an amount and a purchased the essential materials for the flood affected area and were send to the destination spots through college initiation. In the second phase of helping mentality the teachers and students of the college visited some of the flood affected area and provided necessary help including cleaning of the flood affected schools and relief camps and provision of necessary things such as kitchen utensils during the period in the Alappuzha district. Along with this, the faculty members and students of the institution contributed an amount to Chief Minister's Flood Relief Fund too.







Evidence of success

The participation of teachers in the extension service of the college in the form of donations as well as in the form of services have influenced the students in developing desirable attitude among them. They themselves took initiative in collecting and providing financial support for the flood affected area in different places during the period. Not only this some of the students actively participated in the volunteer work activities in the collection camp (Trivandrum Central) without any compulsion.

Problems encountered and Resources required

The greatest problem in organizing the activies as part of best practises was the hectic academic schedule with semester-wise examinations and evaluation procedures. Hence the man power resources required for organizing the events were difficult at times. However, the institution tried to manage every works with maximum possible efforts.
